- Current Bills:
  - O Dyslexia Advocates:
    - Extend, increase amount for tutoring
    - Modify language in Read Well by 3<sup>rd</sup>
    - Connect literacy incentive and Local Literacy Plan requirements
    - Add definition of dyslexia into legislation
    - Goals for legislation: teachers and schools acknowledge dyslexia is real and have programs and support for students
    - Deb: MCRR has policy brief on dyslexia-difficulties of defining
    - Corey: Federal definition of dyslexia, broad/extensive definition:
       "dyslexia is a neurological disorder, often characterized by..."
- Legislative/Policy Liason:
  - Eva Boehm and Bonnie Houck did presentation on advocacy work for MRA going to committee meetings around dyslexia
  - Put forward proposal about transition position beyond volunteer position, be more proactive in legislative presence,
  - Discussion:
    - Put forth counter offer
    - Could defray costs of postion with fees from workshops, etc., do we need 2 for organization our size, way they would represent MRA
    - Reach out to other MN literacy organizations to see if they are politically involved
    - Legal repercussions of paying someone to advocate politically
    - Helpful to have someone help frame MRA position on hot topics
    - Given dwindling membership this may be something the organization offers to members-being informed about what is happening in state.
    - MESPA has similar positon-yearly meetings covering: here's what

happening, here's org. position, and email updates, etc.

- o ILA website has policy briefs/position statements on variety of issues
- Executive council will draft counter proposal about education aspect and questions about advocacy aspect pf proposed paid position

- Current Bills
  - Suggest mandatory retention for students on reading scores
  - o Retention: all data shows harmful to students
- Governor plan to reduce testing
  - Proposed elimination of MCA Math in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade and MCA Reading in 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Test reduction has a high likelihood of going forward

## 12:55-1:40 pm IRA/ILA Transition: Julie Scullen, ILA Board of Directors

- On January 26, 2015 officially became ILA
- Organization is now incorporated in PA, headquarters remain in DE
- Messaging is more import at than name of organization
  - o More cause orientated, more legislative support,
  - o Refocus on issue of 8 million illiterate worldwide
- March 2015 conference website will launch
- July 17-20, 2015 annual conference in St. Louis
