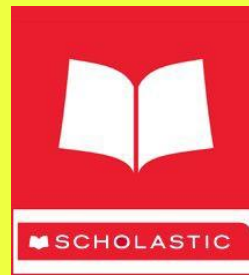

Every Child a Super Reader: Engaging Students for School Success

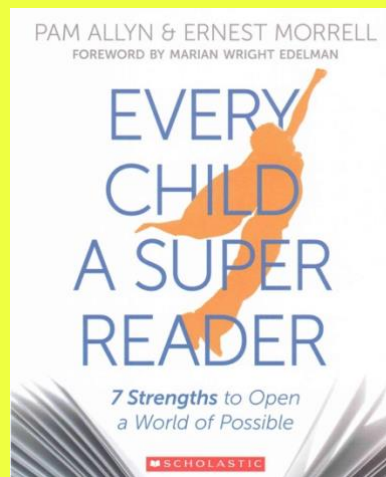
