  - b. no requirement for local membership,
  - may or may not need to collect dues from local councils: local councils should review how they operate and determine if they need to collect dues
  - d. local councils will operate using EIN from MRA
  - e. taxes: local councils will have to send report to MRA-MRA will send report to ILA
  - f. ILA Affiliation Q&A
- Question for Law firm: can EIN be shared?ILA advised calling IRS
- 9. Ambassador Program: Julie Scullen will be in charge, new program building from ground up, rolls out Fall 2018
  - a. Extensive training for leaders to go out to regions to help state and local chapters
  - b. Applicants: people who have been a part of ILA for a long time, will be stipends (yet to be determined)
  - c. Current 2 person staff cannot handle demand
  - d. Option 1 (\$300)-fee for ambassador; fee has not been determined yet
  - e. Other affiliation options no fee for ambassador
  - f. Ambassadors will also review awards
- 10. Can you change affiliation year to year? Harder to move up than down
- 11. A lot of councils were going with \$300 option (NY, CA, NC, etc.)-because of unknowns
- 12. Local councils would no longer need to have bank accounts? Would have sub-accounts per council, treasurers would have MRA checkbook
- 13. Consider hiring a bookkeeper; would help with local councils, too
- 14. MRA needs non-profit and EIN
- 15. \$300 flat rate accounting question: Linda's thoughts at present-councils would transfer balance to MRA and receive
